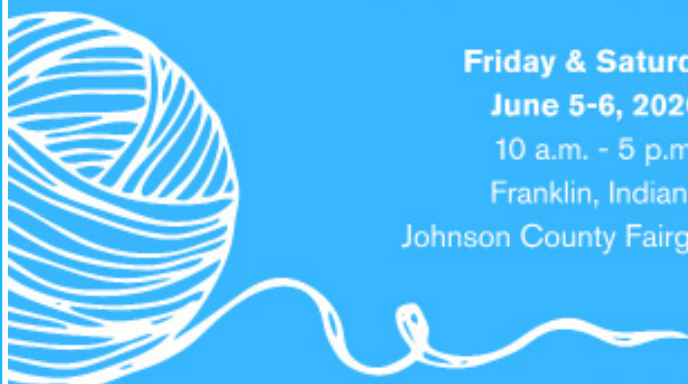

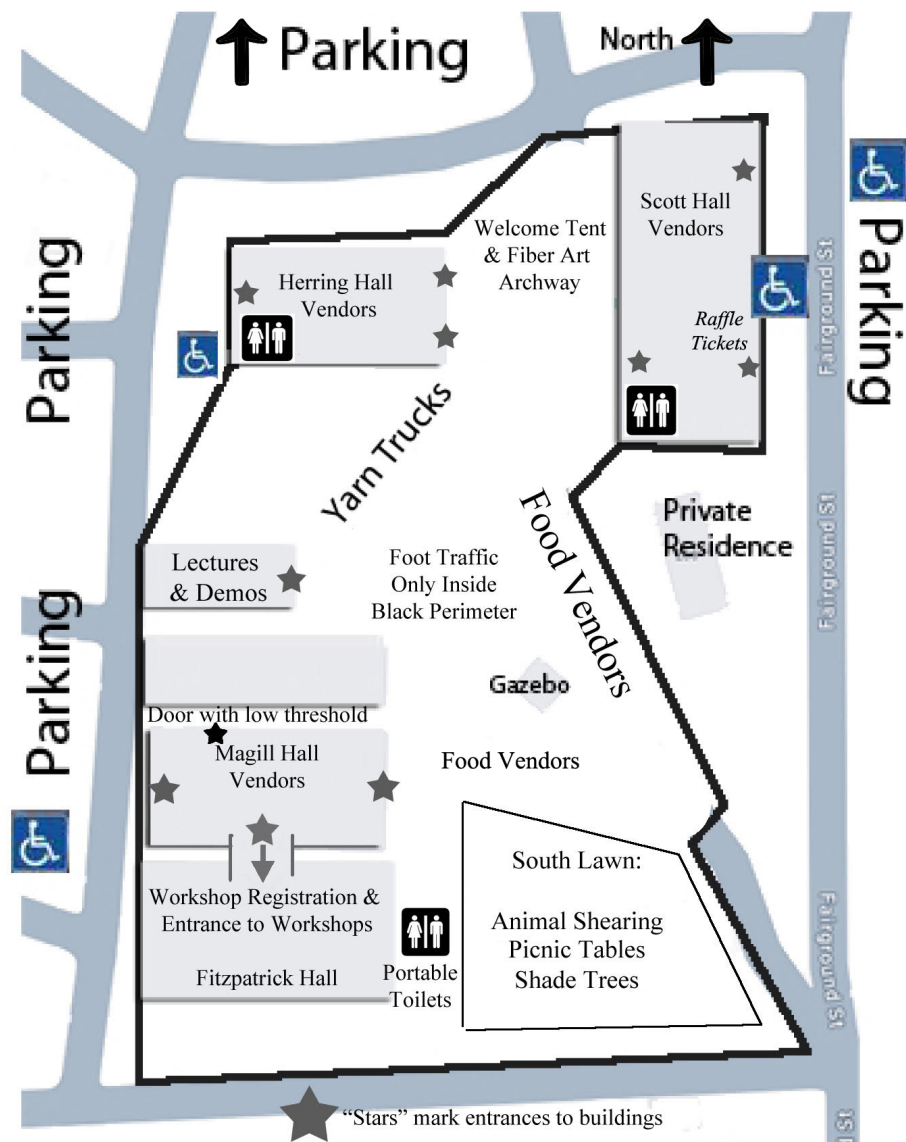
3 buildings full of vendors and 3 yarn trucks!

- By the Fiber Art Archway on the north side of our area.

Parking

- We have marked accessible parking near entrances to each building but is first come first served and on the honor system.
- Parking is also located all around the festival area in the grassy areas, and the long rows of grass north of the area we use.

Accessibility

- The area the festival uses is paved and flat.
- Doors throughout the festival are manually opened, assistance is available as needed.
- Ramps into Magill Hall were provided by the fairgrounds in 2025. If a ramp is not present, please use the standard door down the “alley” on the north side of Magill Hall. It has a low threshold.
- No vehicles inside perimeter marked by black line. Foot traffic only.

Restrooms

- Scott Hall and Herring Hall have indoor restrooms, with accessible bathrooms.
- Portable Toilets will be located next to Magill Hall near the grassy area on the east side. Hand washing station will be located near them.

Animal Shearing

- Shearing demonstrations occur throughout the weekend on the south lawn under the big tree. Talks will be given by Yvonne on Friday at 1:00 P.M. & Saturday at 11:00 A.M.

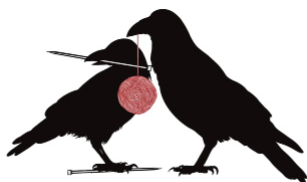

Fiber Arts & Folklore; The Role and Symbolism of Fiber Arts in Storytelling

Ever wonder about the origin of the term “spinning a yarn”?

Join Paige for a lecture on the history of fiber arts, cultural symbolism in traditional arts, and the stories we tell with yarn- specifically what happens when the yarn itself becomes part of the story.

Paige Shipley, an Indiana fiber artist and writer, will be discussing fiber arts and the symbolism of yarn throughout the history of storytelling- from traditional folk stories about the beginning of the world and ancient mythology, to hidden meanings in fairy tales, to more modern (and sometimes magical) uses of yarn and needlework in literature. Spoiler alert- it's never *just* a knitting project.

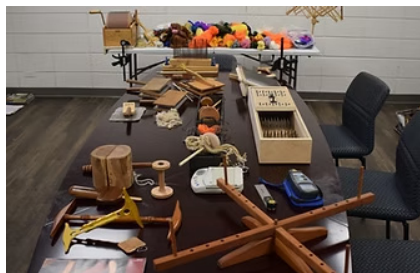
Red, White, and Blue: Revolutionary Dyes and Fibers with Gina Levesque

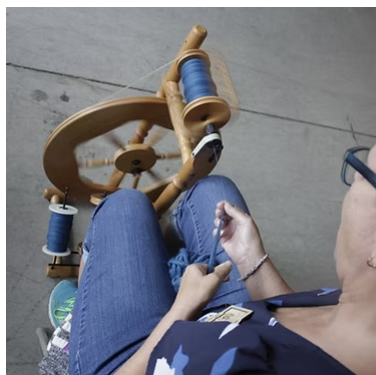

Help decorate the Hoosier Hills Fiber Festival Archway!

Make a butterfly to add to our archway in 2026. Use the pattern here or another of your choosing be it knit, woven, felted, wood, etc. All crafts accepted!

Grab a hook and some yarn, sample uses sock yarn and a G hook, but use what you have: Chain 2. Work all the following in the second chain from hook:

Form lower right wing: 1sc, 1hdc, 3dc, 1hdc, 1sc, 1 slip stitch.

Form upper right wing: 1sc, 1hdc, 2dc, 3trc, 2dc, 1hdc, 1sc, 1 slip stitch.

Form upper left wing: 1sc, 1hdc, 2dc, 3trc, 2dc, 1hdc, 1sc, 1 slip stitch.

Form lower left wing: 1sc, 1hdc, 3dc, 1hdc, 1sc, 1 slip stitch.

To finish, cut 12 inch tail and pull through final loop. Leave ends for tying to archway. With contrast color, cut a 12 inch piece of yarn, pass halfway through a stitch on back of butterfly near the top, hold ends together. Wrap tails 4 times around the middle to form the body. With tails at the top, pass one tail under a loop and tie in a square knot with other tail. Cut tails 1 inch long to make antenna. Bring your butterfly(ies) to the festival and add it to our collaborative art piece!

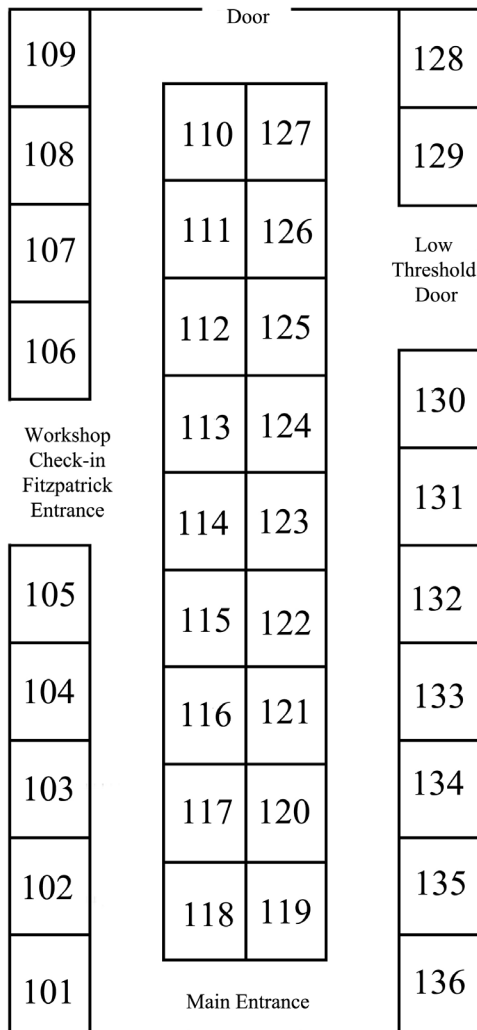

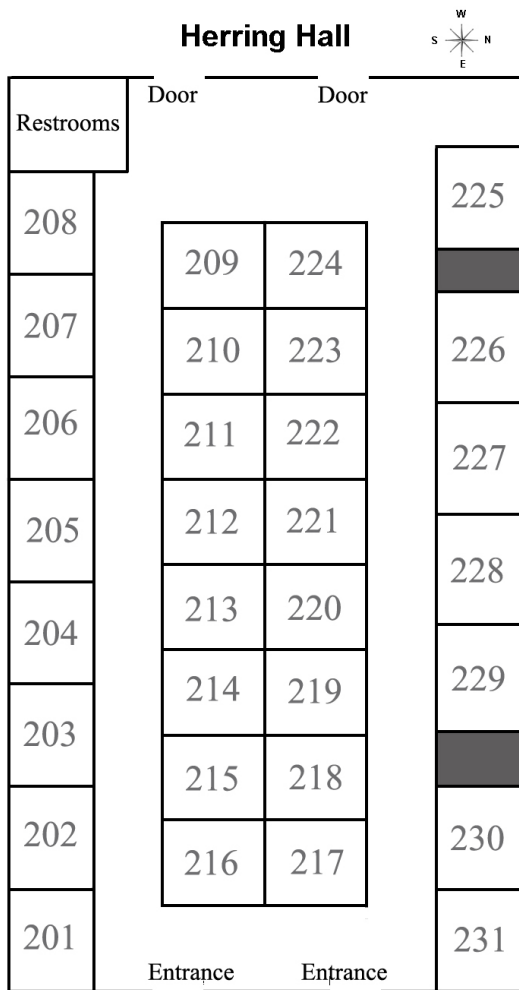

The Hoosier Hills Fiber Festival is in its 20th annual, two-day marketplace with demonstrations, entertainment, lectures, and fiber art related workshops taught by skilled instructors. While visiting the festival, consider taking one of these workshops to expand your knowledge and skill set.

Our vendors provide finished goods, raw fibers, supplies, fiber animals, and tools related to the fiber art world and old-time artisan skills. A majority are Indiana-based and *all* are hardworking, “small businesses” (often 1 or 2 people) and shepherds who greatly appreciate your support of their endeavors.

The festival is FREE to attend and parking is also FREE. Workshops are available for a fee with scholarship opportunities available to help keep fiber art education accessible to all.

Help decorate the entryway arch at the 2027 Hoosier Hills Fiber Festival!

Bring a "raindrop" spiral with you to the festival and add it to our community fiber art project. Use one of the patterns below or make up your own. Get creative and use other crafts to make a raindrop. We love seeing what you can make!

Crochet: Chain 20 stitches. Work 3 single crochet stitches in 2nd chain from hook and in each remaining stitch in the foundation chain.

Knit: Cast-on 20 stitches. Knit front, back, and front (kfbf) into each stitch across. Bind off all stitches.

Pull both tails through the last stitch and use them to tie your raindrop to the archway.

Want to make a longer spiral? Start with more stitches in your cast on/foundation chain.
